NAPLAN – National Assessment Plan

Congratulations to Year 3 & 5 on their NAPLAN results. Once again our school has achieved excellent outcomes.

Year 5 achieved above state average in Reading and Numeracy. Every child in Year 5 has shown growth from Year 3 basic skills test, with most showing significant growth in Literacy and Numeracy.

The Year 3 class average was well above the state average in all areas of Literacy and Numeracy. These results will be carefully reviewed to guide the programming of future teaching and learning in our school.

Year 3/4 Excursion to Borambola

Year 3/4 excursion to Borambola Sport and Recreation Centre will be held during term 4 from Wednesday 25th - Friday 27th November (2 night stay).

The total cost for each student is \$165.00. Thank you to our P&C who will be funding the cost of half this excursion for each child and with the addition of drought funding the final cost for each student will be only **\$45.00**. This is a very inexpensive and wonderful opportunity for all students of Year 3/4.

Year 5/6 Excursion to Sydney

After quite a few difficulties, we have managed to get an approximation for the Year 5/6 excursion.

This cost covers all accommodation at Sydney Olympic Park Lodge, all meals (except lunch on Monday on-route to Sydney and on Friday on on-route home) and all entry fees.

Total cost for each student is approx. \$500. Our generous P&C pays for half of this cost and drought assistance funding will further reduce the cost. Therefore the total cost for each student will be under \$250.

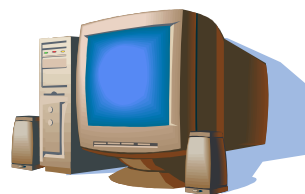

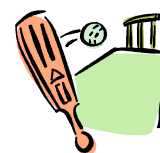
